C-PACE Registered Contractor Terms & Conditions

The C-PACE Program Guidelines found <u>here</u>, state that "Benefited Property Owners should work with a qualified energy auditor and/or contractor with demonstrated experience to define a scope of work for their proposed project. This scope can range from installation of a single Energy Improvement, such as a new high efficiency boiler or a renewable energy system, to a whole building energy upgrade involving multiple, interactive Energy Improvements. A general list of eligible Energy Improvements and their typical energy saving characteristics can be found in the Technical Standards. *The scope of work for the proposed project must be prepared and submitted by a Qualified Contractor or Registered Contractor*."

To be eligible to become a C-PACE Registered Contractor, a contractor must first meet the requirement of a "Qualified Contractor", defined in the C-PACE Program Guidelines as:

An individual or entity who/which meets one of the following:

(1) holds a Certified Energy Manager or Certified Energy Auditor accreditation

(2) is a Professional Engineer with demonstrated relevant energy experience

(3) a contractor with relevant demonstrated experience

If the requirement of Qualified Contractor is met, the contractor may proceed with applying to become a Registered Contractor. Per the C-PACE Program Guidelines, "Registered Contractor" shall mean a contractor who has registered with Green Bank, via the contractor registration process defined below and found at (<u>Get Started - Commercial & Industrial Property Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE)</u>), and remains in good standing with Green Bank.

Getting started as a C-PACE Registered Contractor

- Attend a workshop. Contractor workshops are the best way to learn how C-PACE financing works and are a requirement for registered contractors. (<u>Contractor Training & Events -</u> <u>Commercial & Industrial Property Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE)</u>)
- Fill out an application and, if applicable, provide references. This will enable Connecticut Green Bank to begin processing your information and eligibility so that you can become registered as a C-PACE contractor. (<u>Contractor Sign Up - Commercial & Industrial Property</u> <u>Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE</u>))

Maintaining C-PACE Registered Contractor Status

After becoming a Registered Contractor, the following must be maintained on a *yearly basis* to remain listed as a Registered Contractor (Registered Contractors - Commercial & Industrial Property Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE))

- Be in good standing with the CT Green Bank
- Have at least 1 Approved C-PACE project <u>OR</u>
- Attend a C-PACE contractor training workshop
